EMPATHY: Empowering a Multi-sectoral Pathway Towards Healthy Youth

What are the objectives of the proposed network?

- By intervention in Junior High schools, the following 5 outcomes are sought in High School students:
 - 1. Lowered rates of depression and anxiety, and reduced suicide rates (including attempts)
 - 2. Decreased use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs of abuse
 - 3. Increased attendance and graduation rates
 - 4. Decreased rates of interactions with the justice ministry
 - 5. Lowered costs across a range of ministries (health, education, justice, human services)

What are the biggest challenges your proposed network has to overcome?

- Inter-ministry collaboration can be difficult
- Coordinating multiple levels of care to streamline care for adolescents at high risk
